And we are one of the first business schools in the country to offer an <u>Environmental, Social, and Governance (ESG) Concentration</u>.



ESG Concentration

Complete each of these required Foundational Courses (offered every Fall):

- STRAT 564/EAS 512 Strategies for Sustainable Development I (1.5 credit hours)
- STRAT 565/EAS 513 Strategies for Sustainable Development II (1.5 credit hours)
- STRAT 615 Equity Analytics (2.25 credit hours)

Electives: complete at least 6.75 credit hours, with a minimum of one course from each of the three breadth areas (Environmental, Social, Governance).

Students are encouraged to add the concentration in their first year of enrollment and can complete the Full-Time MBA program in two years.

ESG Design Challenge

Offered from mid-October to early February, this new case competition is hosted by the Erb Institute, Business+Impact, and the Alliance for Responsible Capitalism.

Banks face diverging political pressures, with increasing transparency requirements on one side, and anti-ESG backlash on the other. How might banks navigate these political straits while advancing towards a net zero financial system?

A key part of the competition brief will consist of interviews with stakeholders to the debates around ESG. We are inviting students to help plan and execute these interviews from now through October 20th, the beginning of the first round of the competition.
